

Habitat Clues for Woodland Animals



Red-necked wallabies can be found near dense cover like tall grasses and shrubs.



Short-beaked echidnas like to hide and live underground in burrows.



Damselflies catch their prey mid-air, but rest on plants with their wings closed.



Superb fairy wrens pounce on their prey from fallen logs.



Brown tree creepers peck and probe for insects, on tree trunks branches.



The **superb parrot** nests in hollows of trees.



The **turquoise parrot** flies from tree to tree looking for nectar.



The **eastern water skink** eats worms and insects that hide in fallen sticks and leaves.



The **blue tongue lizard** basks in the sun to keep warm.
